

Ministry of Justice selects prosecutor as representative of Romania to Eurojust

The Ministry of Justice on Wednesday announced that it has selected a prosecutor to serve as Romania's representative to Eurojust - the European Union Agency for Cooperation in Criminal Justice.

According to a press release of the Ministry sent to AGERPRES, the file analysis and interview committee for the office of Romanian national member at Eurojust selected Daniela Buruiana for this office.

"Ms Daniela Buruiana has a vast experience in investigating cross-border organized crime, with over 22 years of experience in the profession. Since 2013, she has carried out complex activities in the field of international judicial cooperation and coordination, as a national member from Romania to Eurojust. She has also led, since 2015, the most important team within Eurojust - the one on cybercrime - with important files at the EU level in her portfolio, such as electronic evidence, data encryption, the portal for the transmission of judicial cooperation instruments, and others," informed the Ministry of Justice.

Eurojust is a unique centre based in The Hague, which is involved in the fight against terrorism and serious forms of organized crime. The Agency coordinates investigations and prosecutions at European level.
