The project is part of the Horia-Arad cluster, which also includes a standalone BESS project recently acquired by Renalfa via a separate transaction, with additional capacities to be further developed into a pioneering power project.

Schoenherr's services included buy-side advice in all phases of the transaction, up to successful closing, including foreign direct investment screening.
